## From the Station of the Exalted Ruler – Jack Meylink

At the same time, I will acknowledge that getting there requires the dedication of some portion of one's time. As you may know, we have opened our last two monthly Sunday breakfasts (2nd Sunday of each month) to try to bring in more business from the people of Auburn and to show off our Lodge. This leads me to wonder if our members read the Auburn Journal more than our Bulletin, but we won't question whatever works. We have made some effort with the Flag Day Ceremony last year and now with our Sunday Breakfasts to bring the Auburn Public to our Lodge so that they can see what we have to offer. While it can be argued that perhaps the donations made by the members of this Lodge to support the victims of the wildfires in Redding and Paradise this year were not exactly local, I am extremely proud of the generosity of our members that contributed. Sometimes we have to stretch the boundaries of what is Local. In addition to our members at large, I especially thank our Officers, PERs, Committee Chairpersons, Event Chairpersons, and all the volunteers that keep us going. Thank you also to our Lodge Manager Bob DiMiceli, Chef Scott, and the other members of our kitchen staff. I look forward to seeing you all at the Lodge (perhaps a little less often on my part) and again thank you for the opportunity to lead this great organization during the past year.





### PROPOSED CHANGES TO LODGE BYLAWS

The following proposed change to our bylaws will be voted on at Lodge Meeting of March 14th and has to do with an existing bylaw that prohibits the wearing of hats or caps.

#### Existing wording:

Dress: Wearing of hats or caps, bare feet, tank tops, or bare chests are prohibited dress in the Club Facility at all times, except for special functions or when authorized by the Exalted Ruler.

#### Proposed change:

Dress: Wearing of hats or caps is prohibited on Elk Meeting nights and at all Special Elk Services. Bare feet, tank tops, or bare chests are prohibited dress in the club facility and Lodge room at all times. Exceptions can be made for special functions or when authorized by the Exalted Ruler.
