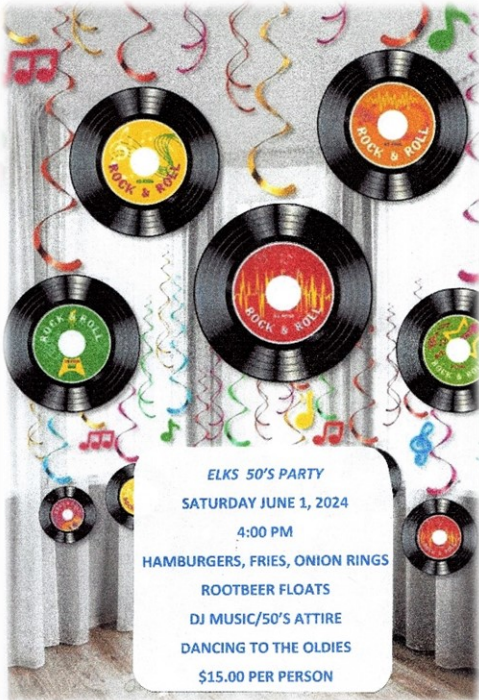
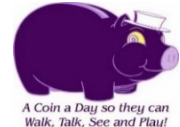

From the Desk of the Secretary – Bill Chelonis



Why do the Lodge doors need to be “locked” and controlled with a membership card for entry during an Elks event or function?

There are two reasons for this. First, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE) is a private club with dues-paying membership. Second, we have a Club License with the Alcohol Beverage and Control (ABC).

Let's discuss the first one. The preamble of the BPOE states: “To inculcate the principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity; to recognize a belief in God; to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its Members; to quicken the spirit of American patriotism; and cultivate good fellowship; to perpetuate itself as a fraternal organization, and to provide for its government.” Membership is a privilege.

The Second reason is that a Club License from the Alcohol Beverage and Control (ABC) states: “The holder of a club license may exercise all of the rights and privileges permitted by an on-sale general license but may sell and serve alcoholic beverages for consumption with the licensed establishment only to bona fide members of the club and their bona fide guests.”

We have many guests coming into the Lodge during functions that are NOT with their bona fide member, nor is the member signing them in the guest register book, which is required. Members, please be present to sign your guests into the Lodge. Guests are not to sign in for themselves. And please don't “TAILGATE” (leaving the door open for someone else to follow you into the Lodge unless you know them). We are finding guests coming in behind other members who don't know these people. We could lose our Club License. This is very serious. Please be aware of who follows you into the Lodge and question them if you don't know them.

VETERANS CORNER

June means Summer is knocking on our door. Be prepared. Sunburns are not allowed or recommended. Use sunscreen. Now, let's get to the meat of this article.

On May 11, 2024, five volunteers from our Lodge and I traveled to the Reno VA hospital for a BBQ that we put on for the Veterans (except those on restricted diets), staff, patients' families and visitors, and our volunteers. In total, we fed about 165 people. We put a smile on everyone's faces as they thanked us repeatedly for the BBQ lunch. It was incredibly heartwarming to see the satisfaction throughout the hospital. We stayed well within our budget while expanding the number of people we were feeding. We served BBQ hot dogs (Costco style), all the condiments, homemade macaroni and potato salad, chips, soda pop/water, and chocolate or vanilla cake. We planned on musical entertainment, but our entertainers were obligated elsewhere. Fortunately, the unit provided outstanding entertainment. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the musical duo. Another by-product of our visit was that we brought 22 lap blankets, many distributed that day to the Veteran patients. All those lap blankets were handmade by members of our wonderful Lodge. A heartfelt thank you goes out to all those who volunteered their time and made these gorgeous blankets. You all helped to put another smile on the faces of those who received a blanket from us. All those blankets will be provided to the resident patients in short order.

My wife, Patty Pelzman, Mark Lund (Chief BBQ'er), Laverne Moran, Lisa Haynes, and Bill and Joyce Costa accompanied me. What a crew!

We are looking forward to returning next year. One point I should make that allowed us to feed everyone was we did not BBQ hamburgers, just hot dogs. Maybe you could volunteer and help us. Remember, the Veterans residing there are medically challenged. They know that, for most of them, it is their last home before they go to realms on high. I met a lady whose father was in hospice care there. She was quite taken by us offering her, and the lady with her, lunch with everybody else. This Veteran had a lap blanket with him but requested another one from us as he was feeling cold. It is difficult for any of us to refuse their request, so, he left with an additional blanket that hopefully kept him a bit warmer when moving about in his wheelchair. Let me add something from my own heart. Our Veterans Account financially supports this effort. All those monies come from our Lodge members. I will be forever grateful to all who donate to this fund. I decided early in May to feed everyone in that hospital. You may ask why everyone and not just the Veterans. That hospital is solely for the use of Veterans. All those employees take excellent care of all their patients and their families. It is just our way of saying thank you to everyone in that hospital for the outstanding service they provided to our Veterans. I want to continue feeding everyone. Feel free to share with me your opinion. Just know that I am a very proud Veteran, and every one of those men and women has a special place in my heart.

By the time you receive this Bulletin, Memorial Day will have come and gone. I hope you did not forget the true meaning of the day. It's a day to honor and remember all those men and women who served honorably in the military. Did you fly our flag high in their honor?

From May 6 through May 9, 2024, we had our annual Placer Veterans Stand Down at The Grounds in Roseville. This was a memorable event aimed mainly toward homeless Veterans as well as low-income Veterans. The event was open and free to any Veteran. Extensive services and products were provided to the Veterans. The turnout appeared to be 300 to 400 people for the event. I was quite busy each day that I worked. It is a rewarding experience. Please contact me if you would like to volunteer in any of these areas.

We have many memorable dates to remember in June, beginning with June 6, 1944, D Day-Operation Overlord, Allied forces invade Normandy; June 14, 1775, Flag Day, the Continental Army was established; June 16 is Father's Day; June 20 Summer begins; June 23, 1865, the last Confederate forces surrendered; June 24, 1948, the Berlin Airlift began; June 25, 1876, the Battle of Little Big Horn began; June 25, 1950, the Korean War began; June 26, 1876, the Battle of Little Big Horn ended.

As we conclude this issue, let us all think about our military men and women serving worldwide, with many serving in harm's way. Please include them in your private prayers along with your family and friends. Just know that God hears our prayers. God Bless America.

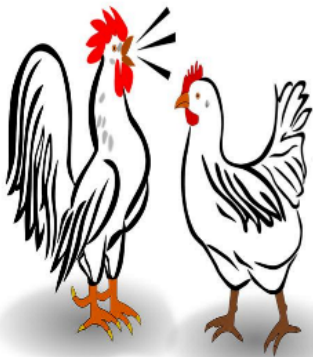

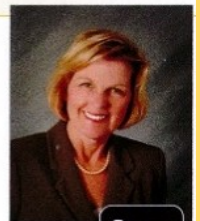
