From the Desk of the Secretary – Bill Chelonis

An interesting Section of the GL statutes is 14.110, indicating the Exalted Ruler can grant, without fee, either an Absolute Dimit or a Transfer Dimit to a member in good standing who is not indebted to the Lodge or Club. The member shall submit in writing their request for Dimit (to another Lodge). Attach their membership card if requesting an Absolute Dimit. The Secretary of the Lodge shall send the Dimit to the Lodge to which a Transfer was requested and **notify the member to contact the local Secretary and give them their name, address, and phone number.**

What's happened, even recently, is that I receive the Transfer Dimit from the other Lodge, which doesn't have the address or phone number of the member requesting to transfer into our Lodge. This causes delays in a member transferring, whether into our Lodge or to another Lodge since we have no way of contacting them. Sometimes, I can contact the secretary of the other Lodge and obtain this information, but again, this causes delays in the Transfer Dimit.

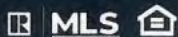
