From the Desk of the Secretary – Bill Chelonis

Why do the doors of the lodge need to be “locked” and controlled with a membership card for entry during an Elks event or function?

There are two reasons for this. First, the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE) is a private club with dues-paying membership. The Second is because we have a Club License with the Alcohol Beverage and Control (ABC).

Let’s discuss the first one. The preamble of the BPOE states: “To inculcate the principles of Charity, Justice, Brotherly Love and Fidelity; to recognize a belief in God; to promote the welfare and enhance the happiness of its Members; to quicken the spirit of American patriotism; and cultivate good fellowship; to perpetuate itself as a fraternal organization, and to provide for its government.” Membership is a privilege.

The Second reason is that with a Club License from the Alcohol Beverage and Control (ABC) it states: “The holder of a club license may exercise all of the rights and privileges permitted by an on-sale general license but may sell and serve alcoholic beverages for consumption with the licensed establishment only to bona fide members of the club and their bona fide guests.”

We have a lot of guests coming into the lodge during a function who are NOT with their bona fide member, nor is the member signing them in the guest register book, which is required. Members, please be present to sign your guests into the lodge. Guests are not to sign in for themselves. And please don’t “TAILGATE” (meaning leaving the door open for someone else to follow you into the lodge) unless you know them. We are finding guests coming in behind other members who don’t know these people. We could lose our Club License. This is very serious. Please be aware of who follows you into the lodge and question them if you don’t know them.

For those of you who are not Veterans, the cost of this meal for you is a mere \$20.00. Remember, it is a time for all Veterans to come together and share their experiences as past service members. This event is open to the public; if you know a Veteran, please invite them. Maybe you could drive that individual to our Lodge. Adult libations will be available from about 11 am throughout the luncheon. So that you know, this event begins at 11 am with lunch served at 12 noon. Take your time and enjoy this event. Talk it up with your fellow Veterans. Donations to offset the cost of this event will be accepted.

This year, we plan to provide the Placer County Veterans Service office with \$50.00 VISA cards for the homeless Veterans in Placer County. We served 85 Veterans, with the rest being staff, guests of the patients (Veterans), and volunteers. Total served was approximately 165. No one went with food that day.

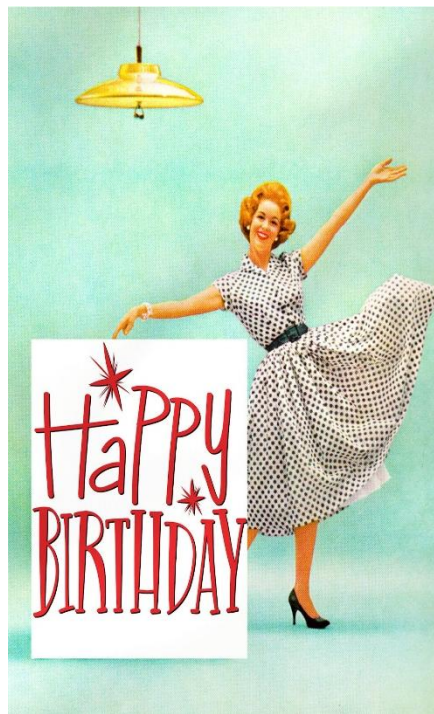
