From the Desk of the Secretary – Bill Chelonis

Pursuant to G.L. Statutes Section 12.050, the Secretary must read on the floor of the lodge how we are doing twice a year. I will summarize this report for those of you who were unable to attend the meeting.

We started the year with 484 members. We have initiated 12, affiliated by dimit 1, and reinstated 1. Stricken from the rolls for non-payment 4, granted transfer dimit 6, granted absolute dimit 0, and 6 members deceased during the year. This gives us a membership of 482, a loss of -2 thus far. We have 44 members who are delinquent in paying their dues. We paid a per capita assessment of \$17,908.00 to the California-Hawaii Elks Association and the Grand Lodge, and \$3,388.00 to the Northeast District. There are seven candidates pending initiation, no pending transfers in, and no pending transfers out of the lodge.

Here we are in December, with so much to be thankful for.

I want to thank Mike Kochis and Gary Nowak for covering the Event Center in Grass Valley for events when I could not cover. My good friend and dedicated Elk, Debby Sullivan, has also covered the Event Center, and together we have been cooking at the American Legion representing both of our Elk Lodges.

The members of the Lodge have opportunities to donate to those who are less fortunate than we are. Daphne Harmon is chairing the Toy Drive with a new twist: a discount on meals when you donate a toy worth \$20. Let's see the bin fill up. Normally, gifts are put under the tree, but this year we made a change and began collecting earlier.

Our purple pigs are put on the tables in the Lodge for each event to collect your change for children with disabilities. As they are filled, Ron Hall collects the money, records are kept of your donations, and the money is sent to the CHEA office in Fresno on a regular basis. They gain a much higher interest rate with all the Lodges in California pooling their donations. Currently, nineteen physical therapists are working with the children the Major Project serves. If you don't know, these services are critical for some children who live in rural areas. Our therapists travel to the children in the program, provide physical sessions for each child, and educate parents and family members on how to support that child.

In Elkdom, there is a program called "Adopt A Veteran." Our Lodge has people supporting our Veterans who live in the upstairs apartments at the Event Center. The apartments are slated specifically for Veterans, and they truly appreciate everything given to them. What we do for them is nothing compared to what they have done for all of us. I want to thank the ATT Pioneers Placer Gold Life Member Club for donating two microwaves to two of our Veterans. The apartments are like a studio space, so a microwave is certainly a must. Lisa Haynes has donated blankets, warm shirts, and shoes for to our Veterans. I also want to thank ER Jim Darnell for donating TV trays for them to use. They are proud men and accept what we offer them, knowing it comes from a place of love.

There are many opportunities for you to give. I am asking you to donate, donate, and donate. The world will be a better place when your love is spread to those in need.

Now that we're in December, I have to report to y'all what we did in November. First off, I trust that you and yours had a wonderful Thanksgiving with family and/or friends. It's getting darker much earlier since we exited Daylight Saving Time.

We celebrated our Veterans with the 15th Annual Veterans Luncheon on November 10. The Lodge served 47 Veterans along with 35 non-Veterans. Once again, everyone raved about how good the meal was this year. All who attended received a thick cut of Tri-tip steak that was smoked by our own Lisa Haynes. Those who wanted seconds did so, though it looked like everyone had a very full plate and no room for a second. The dessert cookies were delicious, soft, and chewy.

Along with the meal, we held a Veterans-only raffle for a patriotic lap blanket, handmade by Debra Owen, a member of our Lodge. Greeting our Veterans were Vicki Harris (along with husband Jim), Val Provan (cashier), and Patty Pelzman. Others who assisted those Veterans needing help were Betty Jo Thomas, Judi Billey, and Patsy (last name provided).

Everything went very smoothly from the cocktail hour through the introductions to the meal.

Putting on a meal of this magnitude takes a great deal of effort and fundraising. Regarding fundraising, I would like to note a few of the larger donations. Bill Costa donated \$330; Ginger Henggeler donated \$200 in honor of her deceased husband, Gene, who was a Veteran and PER; Calvin Kulas donated \$200; Ron Harmon donated \$150. Others donating \$100 were Mike Kochis, John Maderios, and John & Carrie Bottarini. Others who donated were Ty Obenosky, Terri Hauk, Jack Meylink, Jim Harris, Pat Hall, Bob Souza, Peggy Word, Sue Kirk, Mike Barber, Mike Crosdy, Bill Schichtlien, Denny Bacon, Lisa Haynes, and Gary & Nadine Hubbard. We raised enough money to cover the entire event and had a few dollars left over to donate to the Veterans Fund.

All in all, we had a very successful event celebrating our Veterans. Next year, let's share this meal with even more Veterans in the area. Mention it to your friends. The camaraderie amongst the Vets is heartwarming. It appears as though we have seen our last WWII Veteran at the luncheon. We have many from the Korean conflict, while the bulk of our Veterans are from the Vietnam War. The branch of service that continues to dominate in attendance is the US Navy. We have yet to see a Veteran from the US Space Force.

On Tuesday, November 11, Auburn held its annual Veterans Day Parade. Along the parade route, a few thousand spectators, many of them children, were waving the American flag. There was a brief ceremony at the town square before the parade continued to the Placer Bldg. at the Gold Country Fairgrounds. A more formal ceremony was held there, and a light lunch was provided, including pizza, cookies, and a beverage (soda or water). The lunch was served by our Elks Lodge and included Betty Jo Thomas, Nancy Cremarosa, Mark Lund, and Patty and Rudy Pelzman.

The Lodge approved \$2,500 from the Veterans Fund for the purchase of 50 \$50 Target Visa cards. The cards will be provided to the Placer County Veterans Service Officer, who will give them to our homeless Veterans in the county. As of the most recent count of homeless Veterans as of late October, the number was 29. Placer County goes to great lengths to get homeless Veterans into housing and to address all their needs. Kudos to the Placer County Veterans Service Office. The reason we use Target rather than a plain VISA card is the fee. Target VISA cards have no charge; therefore, the Veteran receives the full \$50 value, while the rest charge an \$8.00 service fee.

On the lighter side, "Some guy broke into our house last week. He didn't even take the TV. He just took the remote control. Now he drives by and changes the channels on us." One more... I'm not procrastinating. I'm just prioritizing my relaxation.

In concluding this month's edition, let us all remember the men and women serving in harm's way. December is a difficult month for our service personnel, especially when they are deployed to distant continents.
