It seems we are a month behind in letting you know what the Lodge is doing, but that is because our cutoff is in the middle of the month. I want to thank everyone who came out to decorate the Lodge for the Holidays. It was a fun day, and the Lodge looks great. I would also like to thank everyone who stepped up to decorate the float this year. I especially want to thank Jack Meylink, John Bottarini, and Doug Milliken for covering the Lodge parking lot before the parade started. Thinking outside the box once again, we made \$600.50 from parade attendees who used our parking lot; the proceeds will go to the purple pig. Then Jack jumped over to help Craig hold the banner for the Lodge in front of the float taking Santa down the entire route. Driving the float was Mark Lund, and navigating was his beautiful wife, Debby Lund. Lisa Haynes, her nephew Owen, and I walked alongside the float, greeting all the excited children and adults as Santa came into view. I think there were more people at the parade than there are people who live in Auburn.

Speaking of the Purple Pig, I would like to share some information on the Major Project or "Purple Pig". The Mission Statement is "The California-Hawaii Elks Major Project, Inc., a committee of the California -Hawaii Elks Association, which pledges its commitment to addressing the unmet needs of children with disabilities throughout the state of California and Hawaii by developing a program of supporting services to aid these children at no cost to the families and without discrimination."

In 1050, CHEA created an organization within to help children with disabilities. The fundraising for CHEMPI is the Purple Pig. **IMPORTANT!! All donations are TAX DEDUCTIBLE!!!** This unique program funds 32 paid therapists, speech therapists, and preschool vision screeners to help disabled children when no other organization can or will. These therapists and screeners sometimes travel great distances to help children get the care they need. Many times, the children in elementary schools will have testing such as hearing and vision, and these tests are able to catch medical problems early to help a child going forward in school.

I would like to share our story. John and I raised five sons, with a spread of 12 years between them. Our youngest son was of small stature and had a lisp, which, at the time, many people thought was cute. Come to find out, through a screening at school from the Elks, our son was 75% deaf in one ear. He had a lisp because that was what he was able to hear. At the time, we were grateful for the service, not knowing anything so many years ago about the Elks. Here we are today, serving as volunteers for this amazing organization that not only helps children in need, but also, closer to home, our son when he was young.

If you know and are interested in referring a child for therapy services or having a preschool vision screener visit your family's preschool, please contact Megan Macleod at mmacleodpt@chea-elks.org. Please put your change in the purple pigs on the tables at the Lodge or the ones at home. Bring them in full on the first meeting in February and receive a free dinner in appreciation for your donation to the Major Project.

WIL THOMAS EDUCATIONAL SCHOLARSHIP

This is the seventh year for the Wil Thomas Educational Scholarship. This scholarship's value is \$1000.00 and is for family members of past or present members of the Auburn–Grass Valley Elks Lodge 538. It is offered to seniors who plan to attend a university, college, or vocational school in the Fall of 2026.

CLIFFORD LOOBY SCHOLARSHIP

This is the 20th year that the Looby Scholarship has been offered to graduating seniors planning to attend a university or college in the Fall of 2026. The value of this scholarship is \$1250.00. The senior must be a child, stepchild, or grandchild of an active Elk in Auburn–Grass Valley Lodge 538. Previous winners of this scholarship have graduated from high schools in California (last year), Nevada, Oregon, and Washington.

Happy New Year 2026 to everyone. I hope your Christmas and New Year's celebrations were joyous and rewarding to all. With a new year comes our annual renewal of resolutions. To be honest, I don't make new resolutions anymore. Either I forget them, or I don't live up to them. It's safer not to make any now. Last year was a very productive year for this committee.

On Tuesday, December 9, the committee presented \$2500 in \$50 Visa card certificates to the Veteran Services Officer for Placer County to be distributed to our homeless Veterans and to Veterans in financial straits. \$1,000 was passed on the floor of the Lodge to provide clothing, footwear, bedding, and other related items for the eight Veterans living in the Elks Events Center in Grass Valley. There are nine apartments upstairs, of which eight are occupied by Veterans. The funding will primarily come from a grant from Grand Lodge, and any additional funds will be paid for by the Lodge Veterans account. I think we will have made Christmas a little bit brighter for many of the Veterans residing in Placer/Nevada counties. I look forward to expanding our Visa gift card program to Nevada County. We provide Target gift cards because there is a Target store in most communities. Everything a person needs to live (food, clothing, medicine, etc.) can be purchased at your Target store at competitive prices.

January is a month with little activity from your Veterans Committee, which can be a good thing. One more thing, when beginning a project, if at first you don't succeed, look in the trash for the instructions.

In conclusion, as you reflect on our Veterans serving around the world in harm's way, mention them in your nightly prayers. Do not forget your family and friends, and those who are encountering sickness or distress. God Bless America.
