LEADING KNIGHT – CRAIG COLLOM

Lodge Members,

In attending the State Convention this year, I was reminded of the great service the Elks provide to children with disabilities via CHEMPI (California Hawaii Major Project Inc). As the Leading Knight, a key activity for me is fostering communication about and raising funds for the major project.

For the Elk's 2025/2026 year, the California and Hawaii Lodges, plus the ENF (Elks National Foundation), donated \$4,867,529.67 to the Purple Pig to help children in need. Our Lodge donated \$8,648.50 or \$17.87 "per capita" (Latin for "by heads") or simply "per person". Thank you for your donations.

However, I am sure we can do better in the Elk's 2026/2027 year. Because last year, some members contributed more than the "per capita" while others did not participate. I am asking every member to contribute to the Purple Pig this year. Furthermore, I would like to set a goal of \$25 per member (\$3,500 more than last year) with a stretch goal of \$30 per member (close to \$6000 more than last year). Even if you can't contribute \$25 or \$30, any amount greater than \$0 is helpful. If we all give a little, we can have a big impact for children in need.

Thank you for supporting our Lodge and the Purple Pig.

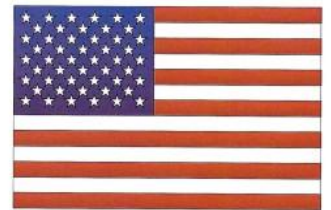

Flag Day in the United States

Flag Day is celebrated annually on June 14 to honor the adoption of the U.S. flag by the Second Continental Congress in 1777.

Date and Significance

Flag Day commemorates **June 14, 1777**, when the Continental Congress passed the Flag Resolution, designating the flag as **13 alternating red and white stripes** and **13 white stars on a blue canton** to represent the original 13 colonies [Wikipedia+1](#). The resolution was passed during the Revolutionary War, when the colonies needed a unified national symbol.

Observances

While **not an official federal holiday**, Flag Day is marked each year by:

- **Flying the U.S. flag** on public and private properties during the week of June 14 [Britannica](#).
- **National Flag Week** proclamations by the president [Britannica](#).
- Educational events, flag displays, and patriotic activities in schools and communities.
- Some states, like Pennsylvania, observe it as a state holiday [Wikipedia](#).
