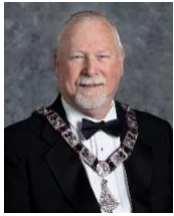

A few items of interest while a member is filling out an application for a new prospective member:

Proposers should put their NAME, ADDRESS, and PHONE Number and SIGN the “front side” of the application. They should also on the “Back side” fill in the section that says “PROPOSER” and sign that as well. Many Proposers are NOT doing this.

Prospective Member: The proposer should make sure the prospective candidate fills out the application COMPLETELY and signs and dates it.

I am finding many applications not completed properly, and I have to return them to the proposer and/or prospective candidate to complete. This delays the process of the new prospective member from becoming a member. The candidate also needs to pay \$75 for the application fee. We are finding that many are not doing this, and it delays the process of bringing in new members.

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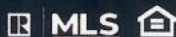

History of the Elks Lodge

The **Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks (BPOE)**, commonly known as the **Elks Lodge**, is one of the largest fraternal and charitable organizations in the United States. It was founded on **February 16, 1868**, in New York City by a group of 15 actors, entertainers, and theater professionals led by Charles Vivian.

Origins: The "Jolly Corks"

Before becoming the Elks, the group was known as the **Jolly Corks**, a private social club formed by performers who wanted a place to gather and support one another. After the death of one member left his family in financial hardship, the group decided to create a more formal organization dedicated not only to fellowship but also to helping members and their families in times of need.

Becoming the Elks

When the organization was officially established in 1868, members voted on a new name and selected the **Elk** as their symbol. The elk was chosen because it represented strength, dignity, and fraternity. The organization adopted four guiding principles:

- Charity
- Justice
- Brotherly Love
- Fidelity

These principles remain the foundation of the Elks today.

Growth Across America

The Elks grew rapidly during the late 1800s and early 1900s. As members traveled across the country, they established new lodges in other cities. The organization eventually received a charter authorizing the creation of local lodges throughout the United States.

By the early 20th century, Elks Lodges had become important community centers, hosting social events, charitable activities, and civic programs. Many lodge buildings became prominent landmarks in their communities.

Community Service and Patriotism

The Elks are known for supporting:

- Veterans and active-duty military
- Scholarships for students
- Youth programs
- Drug awareness education
- Community assistance projects

The organization also played a major role in promoting **Flag Day**. The Elks began observing Flag Day in 1908, helping inspire its recognition as a national observance. Later, President Harry S. Truman, who was an Elk member, signed legislation making Flag Day an official observance in 1949.

The Elks Today

Today, the Elks have approximately 1,800 lodges and hundreds of thousands of members nationwide. Their motto is:

"Elks Care — Elks Share."

The organization continues to focus on charitable giving, community service, veteran support, and youth development.
