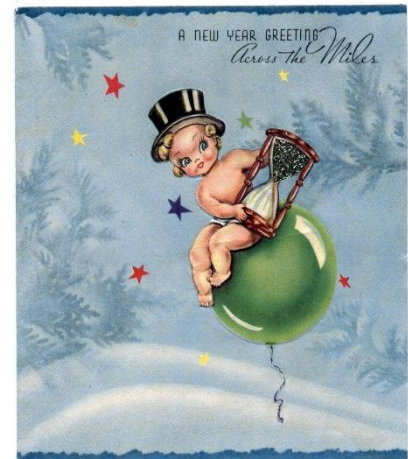

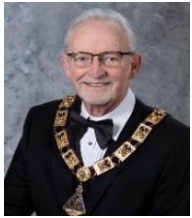

Happy New Year, 2020 Wow! The new calendar year begins just as we start the last quarter of our Lodge year. I believe Leading Knight Bill Chelonis still has opportunities for Officers, Committee Chairs, and committee Members. Please reach out to Bill if you can find some additional time to participate in Lodge activities. January is a great time to commit to the new Lodge year.

Just an update on our primary charities, Elks National Foundation (ENF). GER Duitsman's per-capita goal for this Lodge year is \$4.75. I am pleased to report that our Lodge currently is at \$10.94 per capita more than double the national quota, and we rank 35th of 168 California Lodges. Thanks, and Congratulations to everyone. ENF is the base of all our state and national charitable activities. Next, California-Hawaii Elks Major Project (CHEMPI) last year raised 3.9 million dollars, our Lodge was \$19,435.00. This year's state goal is 4 million dollars, how about our Lodge returning to \$20,000 plus status? Please bring your Purple Pigs to the Lodge for an empty; there is plenty of time to fill another 1 or 2. Our first fundraiser was the Pig Raffle. At this writing, \$3300 had been collected and hope to match the \$5,000 before the New Year's Eve drawing. Our annual Piggy Bank Night is February 27th. 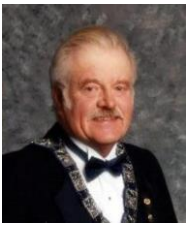

Veterans Corner



Happy New Year to 2020. I trust you survived intact with our recent Christmas holiday and all it entailed. Going forward, we should first look back and see what we had accomplished last year with our Veterans. In the spring, we went to the Reno Veterans hospital with a full crew of Lodge members providing a BBQ luncheon. During the summer (August), we worked the BBQ event back at the Reno VA hospital through our Northeast District. That time a large contingent of district members showed up to work. What a relief that was to me personally as it was my first year as the Northeast District Veterans Chairperson. Providing all the food for both of those events is expensive though we only pay from our Veterans fund for the trip in May. The district pays for the event in August to the tune of about \$600. That is what we spend on our Lodge's trip to the Reno VA hospital. A few months later, we had our Lodge's Veterans luncheon that was very successful. It is getting bigger every year. That event is paid for out of donations and money from the Veterans fund (if necessary). It is becoming difficult to financially support this activity without greater assistance from our Veterans fund. Next is the Veterans Day Parade. We make a substantial donation to the parade committee to support this activity. The amount we provide is between \$200-\$300. Another program we have is the Wall of Honor for our Veterans. The cost to maintain that is minimal but is ongoing.

As you can see, it costs us significant monies to maintain our Veteran's activities. We have no revenue stream for any of these endeavors. It is all comprised of donations by you wonderful Elks. For that, I say, "Thank you from the bottom of my heart." Without you, none of this would happen. I am sharing this with all of you to let everyone know that our funds are slowly being depleted. It took a number of years to raise this capital. There are a few donations we make annually that historically were budgeted items but are now taken from the Veterans fund.

Now, let's look forward to a wonderful new year filled with good cheer, excellent health, and much happiness.

While we enjoy our lives here, let us not forget our troops serving in the Middle East in very harsh conditions. Keep them in your prayers. Please add a note for their families as well. We should always be mindful of our own families and friends as we ask God to bless us all this new year. God Bless America.

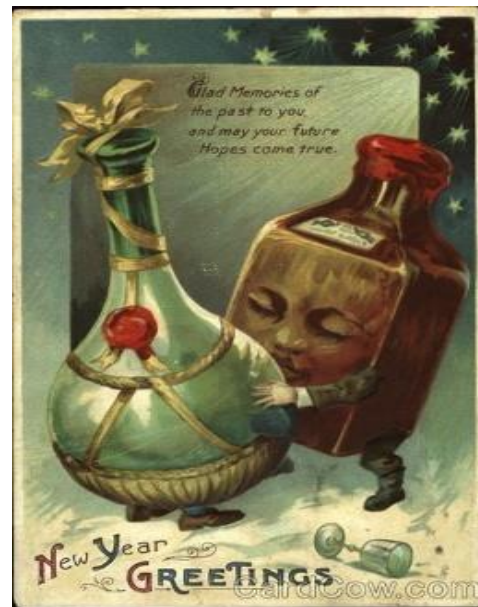
