

April has arrived riding a wave of uncertainty! As of this St. Patrick's writing, our Lodge has been closed since Friday, March 13th, and still do not have a firm date when we will next meet. The uncertainty is, of course, due to the worldwide Coronavirus Covid-19 pandemic. No need to attempt an explanation to speculate on our next few weeks as the rules and measures are fluid and changing daily.

On our last meeting on March 12<sup>th</sup> - Old Timers Night. We presented service pins to 8 of 38 Old Timers present. Ron Harris for 55 years, Walt Drysdale & Ron LeDoux 45 years, Oscar Thompson 40 years, Bill Hopper, Jim Jordan, & Jon Loberg 25 years, and Harry Bedell 20 years. We will make every effort that the remaining 30 receive their pins as soon as possible.

As of this report, I may still be your outgoing ER and Secretary-Elect, and we will do our best to schedule our next meeting, including the installation of officers for the 2020-2021 Lodge year. As Secretary-Elect, I face a significant learning curve. Fortunately, retiring Bob Oles with assistance from Murriel, Elly Brown-Silva, and Jimmy Mullenix, are all working very hard to assure mailing and receipt of dues for the 2020-2021 Lodge year are progressing on schedule. Your prompt response is very much appreciated, as many of our financial requirements are dependent upon dues received by April 1st.

The primary reason has roots in our obligation as ELKS, that admittance to our Lodge and any other Lodge is dependent upon presenting a current membership card. The secondary reason is equally important. The California ABC issues our club/bar license for members and their guests only. That requirement is not optional. If you received your statement, please return with payment as soon as possible. If you have not received a statement, please stop by or call the office to receive a replacement. We are never at 100% renewal on April 1st, for a variety of valid reasons, travel, health, address changes, etc. Options are available. Bring your statement with payment to the first event you attend. Credit/debit cards, or cash payments, are always accepted at the bar.

In support of the primary and secondary rules above, we enforce a locked door policy for almost all Lodge events, admittance made possible with your card key. The card keys are not disabled April 1st, a grace period to allow for some of the exceptions above and eliminate the duplicate labor (volunteer) of disabling and enabling of cards. Year-round, but especially early in the Lodge year, we utilize Greeters to assist with compliance with the closed-door policy. Please assist our volunteer Greeters. Use your card key for admittance, present your membership card, and for some extra help, wear your badge. Early on I plan to do some greeting personally, (1) I will use my card, (2) display my membership card, & (3) wear my badge, please join me with 1 & 3 and if we haven't met introduce yourself.

Hopefully, this message will be received with clarity and better news when you all read this, be careful and stay safe, and you all receive this limited information in good health.



Just remember, it is always a pleasant and peaceful interaction that we have with all the patients. Just a note, I have never had a bad or unfortunate experience in that hospital. I will follow-up with some last-minute information in next month's article.

As I close this article, I am reminded of the frailty of man. Right now, we are in the midst of a health crisis all over the world. Maybe, by the time you receive this, it will have subsided and entered into our history books. Remember to take good care of yourself as you cannot help others when you are battling a significant illness. Pray for our military and their families. 






# The Elks Creed - 1904
