



A heads up for November & December Lodge activities, check this bulletin and next month for all the special holiday-themed activities.


November special events include the Birthday Dinner on November 1, Veterans Lunch November 8, and Elks Thanksgiving Dinner on Sunday, November 24.





As mentioned in the October bulletin, one of the many responsibilities of the Leading Knight is chairman of the House Committee. It is the responsibility of the House

If we don't do this, we will not be able to pay our bills, and that is something I cannot allow as chairman of the House Committee. These are hard decisions, and I wish there were some other way. Please keep in mind that as Elks, we still enjoy many of these events at a much lower cost than at a restaurant or bar. RV Club News – Oceano Outing


