From the Station of the Exalted Ruler – Harlan Moore



First, it was an honor and privilege to represent our Lodge at 155th Grand Lodge Convention in St. Louis, Missouri June 30th through July 3rd. The opening ceremony featured the parade of flags, beginning flags of first responders, including law enforcement, firefighters, and emergency medical services. They were followed by the flags of all fifty states, the District of Columbia, four US territories; the flags of the five branches of the US armed services; the POW-MIA flag; the flag of Benevolent Order of Elks. Finally, to close the parade, the members of the Grand Lodge Fraternal Committee escorted the world's greatest symbol of freedom, the flag of the United States of America, to the front of the stage and paused as the assembled Elks recited the Pledge of Allegiance. Not to be overlooked all the flags presented accompanied by the Illinois Elks Pipe & Drummers, a display of patriotism and pageantry to match any I have ever seen. Sunday's featured report was by PGER F. Louis Sulsberger, Chairman of the Elks National Foundation Board of Trustees. To briefly summarize his report of the \$36.9 million budget, an astounding 93 percent goes to program spending—well above the industry standard of 65 percent. ENF is the core of charitable spending throughout our order. Please remember ENF when planning contributions this Lodge year, our per-capita goal for the year remains at \$4.75, with your help we can exceed that goal again.

The sessions Monday through Wednesday included reports from every phase of Elkdome; highlights were for the first time in 39 years we celebrate a National Gain in Membership, the work of our Grand Lodge Membership and Marketing Department to embrace its motto, Grow by Change, Not by Chance. The convention, of course, featured the nomination, election, and installation of California's own Robert L. Duitsman as Grand Exalted Ruler, for 2019-2020, his theme Honoring the Past-Embracing the Future. Running out of room here, still working on a method to present a summary of the entire convention to report to the Lodge floor and post on the bulletin board, stay tuned.

Our official visit from our own Yvonne Edwards CHEA Vice President for the Northeast District was held July 11th. The event was well presented, well attended, and many thanks to all who contributed to this success.

Coming up in August the Lodges Northeast District will be welcoming CHEA President Tim Jaeger, and First Lady Sandy August 16-17, our Lodge will be honored to host dinner Saturday evening.

Finally, please share our good work with others "Ask a friend or family member" to become an ELK to join us in the important work and social activities we all enjoy.

Remembering Barney

James Richard "Barney" Gruber passed away on June 29, 2019. He was an Elk for 50 years and served Auburn Lodge as a Trustee and was the Elk of the Year in 2006-07. But that says little about the man who was my friend, both in and outside Elks.

He and Lois were active in many of the Lodge functions. They were members of the RV Club before there was one and enjoyed camping from Dillon Beach to Woodchuck Flat and for many years were wagon masters for the Paradise campout in early March of each year. They also chaired the annual luau where the patio was transformed to the Hawaiian Islands complete with mai tai bar and South Pacific dancers and for many years the Gruber Ranch was the site of the Elks' Family Picnic.
