With the total raised that night and, in the days, afterward along with the matching funds from our Charity Account, we will have sent a total of just over \$4600 to Paradise Lodge #2026 Fire Relief Fund. As I mentioned before these funds are designated for Paradise Lodge members to help them get their lives back together. The Lodge itself is fully insured and will make sure that the contributions to this fund go to the members in need. Also, we voted to send \$500 from our Veterans Fund Account to Quincy Lodge to help a member/veteran of their Lodge and his family who lost everything in Paradise Fire. This was obviously a real need, but since he was a member in Quincy and not Paradise, he most likely would not be the beneficiary of funds we sent to Paradise.

Closer to home, on December 13th I loaded my pickup with all the toys that our members donated to the children in our community and delivered them to the Salvation Army. I do mean loaded - the pickup bed was full, the back seat was full, and the front passenger seat was full. It was all I could do to make it in one trip. The Salvation Army had informed me that they had a list of approximately 200 local families that would be receiving these toys.


Thank you to all our members for your wonderful generosity in supporting these causes. It is through efforts like this that I am, and I hope you are truly proud to be an Auburn Elk.







New Year's Traditions From Cultures Around The World

Spain

In <u>Spain</u>, it is customary to eat 12 grapes – one at each stroke of the clock at midnight on New Year's Eve. Each grape represents good luck for one month of the coming year. In bigger cities like Madrid and Barcelona, people gather in main squares to eat their grapes together and pass around bottles of cava.

Colombia

In hopes of a travel-filled new year, residents of <u>Colombia</u> carry empty suitcases around the block. That's one New Year's tradition we can get behind!

Denmark

Residents of <u>Denmark</u> greet the New Year by throwing old plates and glasses against the doors of family and friends to banish bad spirits. They also stand on chairs and jump off of them together at midnight to "leap" into January in hopes of good luck.

Scotland

During <u>Scotland's</u> New Year's Eve celebration of Hogmanay, "first-footing" is practiced across the country. The first person who crosses a threshold of a home in the New Year should carry a gift for luck. Scots also hold bonfire ceremonies where people parade while swinging giant fireballs on poles, supposedly symbols of the sun, to purify the coming year.

Philippines

You'll find round shapes all over the <u>Philippines</u> on New Year's Eve as representatives of coins to symbolize prosperity in the coming year. Many families display piles of fruit on their dining tables and some eat exactly 12 round fruits (grapes being the most common) at midnight. Many also wear polka dots for luck.



This man lost everything but has been given some relief and aid from the Elks out of Quincy. \$500 from our Veterans fund was sent specifically to help this Marine re-establish himself and his family. 
Remember our military serving in harm's way in the Middle East. Please keep them in your prayers and may they all have a safe return to their homes here where all of them have family and friends. God Bless America.

CHAPLAIN'S CORNER

Chaplain's Corner - Bill Costa

Saint Paul tells us that "At the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth; and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord." From the earliest days of Christianity, Christians have known the great power of Jesus' Holy Name.

As the once-popular hymn commanded:

All hail the power of Jesus' Name!... Let angels prostrate fall:

Bring forth the royal diadem...And crown Him Lord of all.

Small wonder, then, that the Church sets aside the first month of the year in honor of the Holy Name of Jesus. Through this devotion, the Church reminds us of the power of Christ's Name and encourages us to pray in His Name. In our society, of course, we hear His Name uttered quite often, but all too frequently, it is used in a curse or blasphemy. In the past, Christians would often make the Sign of the Cross when they heard Christ's Name uttered in such a manner, and that's a practice that would be worthwhile to revive.

Another good practice that we could take to heart during this Month of the Holy Name of Jesus is the recitation of the Jesus Prayer. This prayer is as popular among Eastern Christians, both Catholic and Orthodox, as the rosary is among Roman Catholics, but it's not well known in the West.

This month, why not take a few minutes to memorize the Jesus Prayer, and pray it during those moments of the day when you are between activities, or traveling, or simply taking a rest? Keeping Christ's Name always on our lips is a good way to ensure that we draw ever nearer to Him.
