## Paradise Lodge Update

I am sure that by the time you read this article the situation will have changed in Paradise. At this time the Camp fire is 95% contained. The rain has assisted in extinguishing hot spots and smoldering fire. All containment lines continue to hold. It was relatively smoky in Auburn but not nearly as bad as down the hill. The primary reason for this article is to relay to all our members news about what we have done at Auburn Lodge so far to assist in the ongoing recovery for Paradise Lodge and its members. At Taco Tuesday, November 13th, we passed the hat (and boot) to raise money for the Paradise Lodge Fire Relief Fund. Thanks to the generosity of our members we have collected over \$2,500 for the fund. I announced that we would match the portion that was raised on Tuesday night with funds from our Local Charities account but, this decision must be made by the members on the floor of the Lodge. Keep in mind that this account continuously receives funds from our opportunity drawings on Taco Tuesdays

We have also been made aware of an Elk and Veteran from Quincy Lodge who along with his wife and three boys lost their home in the Paradise Fire. I have talked with Rudy Pelzman, and we will be making a motion to take some funds from our Veterans account to help this family that has lost everything.

We will continue to collect funds at the Lodge for the Paradise Fire Relief Fund. You may also contribute directly to the California Hawaii Elks Major Project Emergency Disaster Fund that has been set up to aid Elks that have been impacted by the recent fires.


