# From the Station of the Exalted Ruler – Jack Meylink





I was told that I needed to report back to the Lodge regarding my recent trip to San Antonio, Texas for the Elks National Convention:

The margaritas at the Agave Bar and Margaritaville were very good. The Beers at the Bier Garten, Coyote Ugly, Howl at the Moon, Hotel Manager, Crockett Hotel, and the Yardhouse were all refreshing. The Hospitality in the Alaska, Texas, South Coast District - Ca, and Central Coast District - CA hospitality suites were outstanding. We also sampled some very good beers at Alamo Brewing Company and Blue Star Brewing after the convention had ended.

But I probably should report on the convention itself: Over 8,000 Elks registered and attended the convention. The Sessions opened on Sunday afternoon with Welcome and introductions as well as reports from Elks National Foundation Trustees, Hoop Shoot, and Scholarships. This was followed by a speech from outgoing Grand Exalted Ruler Malcom McPherson Jr.

After the opening session, a special 150th-Anniversary Celebration took place with entertainment provided by Gary Sinise and the Lieutenant Dan Band.

On Monday morning the session began with various introductions and recognitions followed by reports from the Grand Exalted Ruler, the Elks National Convention Commission, the Board of Grand Trustees, the National Memorial and Publication Commission, Veterans memorial Restoration Trust, the Activities Committee, the Fraternal Committee, and the Committee on Judiciary. The Committee on Judiciary presented the 15 resolutions proposed the amend the statutes of the order. The session concluded with nominations and election of Grand Lodge Officers for 2018-2019 followed by introductions and celebration. Our new Grand Exalted Ruler is Michael T. Luhr. He and his First Lady, Barb are from Petersburg, Alaska Lodge #1615. His announced theme for the year is "Working together to make a difference". In the afternoon I attended a workshop on Elks National Foundation Grants which was very informative.

On Tuesday there were again many committee reports from Grand Forum/Pardon Commission, Disaster Relief Fund, GL Auditing and Accounting, Government Relations, GL Public Relations and Marketing, GL Fraternal Commission, GL Activities, Drug Awareness Program, and the National Veterans Service Commission. This was followed by the balloting on the 15 resolutions proposed on Monday. In the afternoon I was able to sit in on the Ritual Performance of one of the four finalists. This was the Okmulgee, Oklahoma Lodge and they turned out to be the First-Place team. Wednesday results of resolution balloting were presented. 12 of the 15 resolutions proposed were passed and 3 rejected. A listing of the 15 resolutions and voting results is included in this bulletin. A memorial service was held for three Past Grand Exalted Rulers who passed during the past year: Kenneth Moore, Robert Sabin, and Ted Callicott. This was followed by the installation of the Grand Lodge officers and remarks from the new Grand Exalted Ruler. The Grand Exalted Ruler district deputies were then installed. The newly installed DD for the Northeast District of California which our Lodge is a member of is Dave Saltel. This was then followed by various special resolutions and presentations and the closing ceremony.

Although this concludes my official report of the 154th Grand Lodge session I will be happy to answer any other questions you may have or provide you with session documents to review if you wish.




Chaplain's corner - Bill Costa


