
Wreaths Across America







There will be services at all the local cemeteries that day with the first one at 9 am at the New Auburn cemetery, followed by the ceremony at the Old Auburn Cemetery at 10 am, and 11 am at the Auburn Indian Cemetery. The Newcastle Cemetery ceremony will be at 12 pm.

At present, we have an expectation that the bench donated this year by our Lodge will be in place for the ceremony at the Old Auburn Cemetery by Memorial Day. This project to place a granite bench at both the Auburn cemeteries has been in the works for about 5 years. When it was determined that Grand Lodge would not accept a grant application for monies to pay for this patriotic endeavor, we then began raising funds to do so. This project is now completed and those who want to visit our locally interred military will have a place to sit while in the Veterans section. Thank you very much to those of you who donated to this very worthwhile cause.
