
Wreaths Across America



At present, we have an expectation that the bench donated this year by our Lodge will be in place for the ceremony at the Old Auburn Cemetery by Memorial Day. This project to place a granite bench at both the Auburn cemeteries has been in the works for about 5 years. 


MAY BIRTHDAY DINNER


