





From the Station of the Leading Knight – Harlan Moore



Finally, special thanks to all the kind words & support from so many of you since I raised my hand in January, I will give it my very best to earn your trust and support.






CRYING CORNER



Easter is linked to the Jewish <u>Passover</u> by much of its symbolism, as well as by its position in the calendar. In most European languages the feast called Easter in English is termed by the words for Passover in those languages and in the older English versions of the Bible, the term Easter was the term used to translate Passover. <u>Easter customs</u> vary across the <u>Christian world</u>, and include <u>sunrise services</u>, exclaiming the <u>Paschal greeting</u>, <u>clipping the church</u>, and decorating <u>Easter eggs</u> (symbols of the <u>empty tomb</u>). The <u>Easter Lily</u>, a symbol of the resurrection traditionally decorates the <u>chancel</u> area of <u>churches</u> on this day and for the rest of Eastertide. Additional customs that have become associated with Easter and are observed by both Christians and some non-Christians include <u>egg hunting</u>, the <u>Easter Bunny</u>, and <u>Easter parades</u>. There are also various traditional <u>Easter foods</u> that vary regionally.


