









Hello Fellow Elks,

From the Secretary Bob Oles

I was shocked and saddened when I learned Niel Bielski passed away. I had talked to him a few days before. Niel and I did many jobs together. And in the Elks, we also did a lot of things together. When I was Exalted Ruler of our Lodge Niel was Loyal Knight. In 1988-1989 I was the Grand Lodge Representative of California's Northeast as District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler; that same year Niel was the California-Hawaii Elks Association Northeast District Vice President. In 1997-1998, Niel was elected to serve the Grand Lodge as District Deputy of the Northeast District.

A little history: The California-Hawaii Elks Association is divided into 19 districts and each district selects a Vice President to aid the State Association President in seeing that the Lodges in their District are carrying out the CHEA programs. Each District also selects a District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler who works for the Grand Exalted Ruler to make sure that all Lodges in their districts are complying with the Grand Lodge programs. and if a Lodge has a problem to make sure that the problem is corrected.

The Northeast District was formed in July of 1978, and Carl Beyer of Nevada City Elks Lodge No. 518 and A.J. "Tony" Borelli of Lake Tahoe Elks Lodge No. 2094 were District Leaders. Russell D. Brown of Susanville Elks Lodge No. 1487 was our first District Deputy Grand Exalted Ruler and Marion "Gene" Malson of Alturas Elks Lodge No. 1756 was our first Association Vice President. In 1982, the Northeast District welcomed Grand Exalted Ruler Marven Lewis of Brawley, California on his official visit to our District; Auburn Lodge No. 1691 was the host Lodge. It is the only time that a Grand Exalted Ruler has made an official visit to our district.

We still have 31 members who have not paid their dues. Good news we have 12 candidates for initiation.

If you have a change of address or need to order a name badge, we have order forms in the office or at the bar. Please remember to print legibly so that the correct information gets to the Secretary and if you lose your key card there is a \$10 charge to replace it.

A VERY MERRY CHRISTMAS CRAFT FAIRE


The Christmas 2017 Craft Faire was a very fruitful endeavor for Auburn Elks. The Team raised \$530.00 for our Lodges Veterans fund.







Carl had many compliments to express about Bob and his character.
