

The Best People on Earth – Fundraiser for Ethan

The Best People on Earth. We hear this phrase used from the BPOE acronym, but nothing can really send that phrase home as when the members of the Elks organization pull together like they did this week. An email plea for help was received by Exalted Ruler Rhonda Rogers and Lecturing Knight Jim Boston of Auburn Elks Lodge No. 1691. A 14-year-old boy was to have a liver transplant the following Monday, Aug 21 and the parents needed to have \$6 to \$10 thousand dollars to put toward the facility where the boy was to recuperate after the surgery. The surgery was being withheld until the parents could show payment readily available. They, themselves had about \$3000.00, so they needed a minimum of \$3000.00 additional for the operation to go forward.

There was an announcement made about the situation to the members of Auburn Elks that evening who were attending Taco Tuesday and the next day at Wednesday lunch in Auburn. The members reached deeply right then and there, and donated \$1477.00! The idea of a

Spaghetti dinner fundraiser came up, and the Grass Valley Lodge agreed to host the event. It all came together in two days on Thursday Aug 17th! Members of Auburn, Grass Valley and Nevada City Lodges came and helped at the spaghetti feed fundraiser. The money gleaned from that fundraiser was over \$1800.00. More money showed up before the end of the evening; and so, the parents received a total of over \$3400.00 from the Elk efforts which more than met the parents' goal to be able to get their son into the operating room to that date. On Saturday Aug 19th Jim Boston, Niel Bielski, and Dan Fisher stood outside Meritage Motors in Auburn and collected about another \$1600.00. About \$350 was donated Aug 19th evening at the CHEA president's visit. Norma Harris gave a check for \$1000.

We collected a total of well over \$6000.00 in those few days. It's times like these that make me proud to be an Elk!



Greetings, it's time to Remember, and Honor our Veterans by buying a wreath to be laid on a Veteran's grave this December at the New & Old Auburn Cemeteries. This tradition has been in place across the United States at our National Cemeteries for the past 30 years, but only recently has this tradition been available to us in Auburn at our Community Cemetery. The first year was 2015, and we sold enough wreaths to honor 647 Veterans at the New Auburn Cemetery. Last year we doubled our sales and honored all Veterans at the New Cemetery, with some of our wreaths going to loved ones buried at the Old Cemetery, too.

Our goal for 2017 is to Honor ALL Veterans in both cemeteries with a beautiful balsam wreath. That will require at least 1,000 more wreaths to be sold by Veteran's Day – our deadline for wreath sales for this year.

The cost of a single wreath is \$15.00, and many of our Elks have been generous enough to purchase more than one at a time. To them we say, "Thank you," but if \$15.00, is in your budget, we are grateful for your purchase of a single wreath. Without your participation, a Veteran buried here in Auburn will go without a wreath honoring their service to Country. *FYI: The Lodge's Veteran's Service Committee will receive \$5.00 for every wreath you buy.*

The theme for our 2017 Remembrance Ceremony is "*I'm an American. Yes, I am*!" which was inspired by a song by Rick Charette. Rick wrote "I'm an American" in 2002 to help children appreciate the sacrifices women and men have made in protecting the American freedoms we all enjoy.

We will be gathering on December 16th, 2017, at 9:00 A.M., at the New Auburn Cemetery as Americans. Our mission is to welcome all to join us to Remember and Honor those who served their country for our freedom, including the freedom to be different. We will be gathering as one to support those in the military, and their families, Remembering the fallen, Honoring those who serve, and Teaching the next generation the true meaning of freedom.

There is a deadline to buy wreaths (Veteran's Day, November 11th), but we hope you'll buy yours early, in order to beat the last-minute rush. 


