April 7 & 8, 2017**

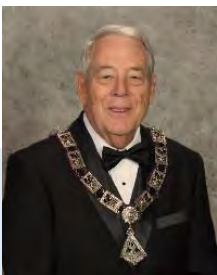

We are now one month into our new Lodge year and at this writing, more than 180 members have not yet paid their 2017-18 dues and are delinquent. Remember, if your dues are not current you may be denied access to the Auburn Lodge and club. Also, if you are traveling and plan to visit other Elks Lodges, you must provide your current dues card.

Per capita assessments are based on the beginning membership on April 1st each Lodge year. The amounts paid are as follows: Grand Lodge - \$12,064, California Hawaii Elks Association - \$4,901, CHEA Northeast District - \$2,255, for a total outgoing of \$19,220. That means that the dues of more than 118 members whose dues were paid by the first of April, as required, were immediately paid out. Every member has the opportunity to see where the remaining funds are allocated by checking the Budget posted on the bulletin board at the Lodge.

My health continues to improve and we are hopeful that I will be at 100% soon. I am truly grateful for the assistance of all who lend a hand when I am at the Lodge and especially to PER and State Association Vice President Designate Jimmy Louis who has done an outstanding job keeping the minutes in my absence. We all have a lot of work to do to bring our membership back up to cover for the loss of 58 members total which was a result of deaths, transfers out, and those members who chose not to continue to be Elks.

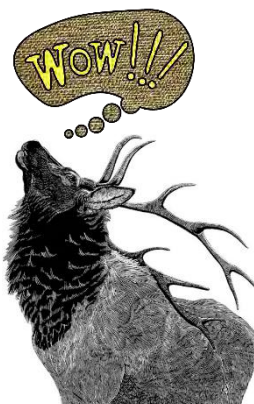

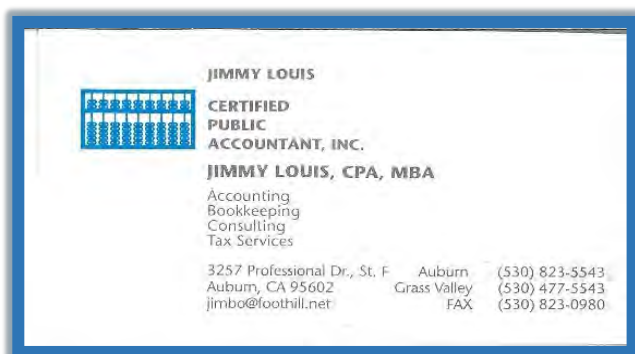

Ardy Fegard, wife of member Roy Fegard, has passed away. Ardy and Roy are also very active in the RV Club.


John and Linda Simmons have lost a daughter, Judi, who passed on April 9th. Linda is one of the editors of this newsletter.
