




CREW Lodge Cleanup Reminder

Tom Hart, our bulletin editor, has been out of commission the past couple weeks after throwing his back out. He is waiting input from the neurosurgeon and resting at home.




Crying Corner

Auburn Elks Scholarships

The Clifford Looby Scholarship 2016-2017

Clifford Looby was born in North Dakota in 1900. He moved to Auburn in 1923 and joined the Auburn Elks Lodge in 1965. He was active in the Lodge working in the kitchen and was a member of the Lodge Trap Shooting Team. He was Elk of the Year for the 1971-1972 Lodge year. He passed away in Salinas, California in 1989. He bequeathed to the Lodge \$10,000 to be used as a Heritage Scholarship.

This is the eleventh year of the Looby Scholarship program. The scholarship is for a graduating high school senior who is planning to attend a college or a university in the Fall of 2017. The senior must be a child, step-child or grandchild of an active Elk in Auburn Lodge #1691. The value of the scholarship is \$1,000. Applications will be available as of the October 27th Lodge meeting. Applications may be picked up at the Lodge or obtained from Jim Harris (Looby Chairman). In the past, winners have attended high school in California (last year), Nevada, Oregon and Washington. The application must be post marked no later than February 28, 2017. The winner will be notified by mail in March, 2017

Legacy Award

If the student is a son/daughter or grandson/granddaughter (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of an Elk member (at any location in the country) they could receive \$4000.00 (\$1000 per year for 4 years). More information and applications can be found on the Elks National Foundation web site.

Vocational Grant

If the senior or person wishes to ONLY GO TO A TWO (2) year college (Not 4 years) they may be eligable for a "Vocational Grant". This grant is handled through the State Program. Most seniors don't realize this is available for AA & AS degrees (dental or nurse's aid etc) they can receive \$1000 per year for 2 years.
